Addison Budget Report 2025-2026

Recently, Mr. Peiffer, Superintendent and Mr. Everly, Executive Director of Finance and Operations, were interviewed to discuss the upcoming school budget in the interest of providing transparency to the public. Each November, the budgeting process begins and extends to the budget vote in May of the current school year. Due to this deadline and to be best prepared, the process begins with asking questions and trying to be ahead of upcoming expenses. The budget is also discussed at every board meeting from January through May.

Mr. Everly: "This year, we've seen cost increases that are higher than in most prior years. Health insurance premiums have gone up significantly, utility costs like electricity and heating have spiked, and the prices for transportation and contracted services continue to climb. Even the cost of basic instructional supplies and food services has risen. Despite these financial pressures, our priority remains the same: maintaining the quality of our programs and continuing to create positive opportunities for students across the district. That balance is always our goal as we work through the budget process."

The most important aspect of budget planning, as stated by Mr. Everly, is prioritizing the programs. The district wants to promote every opportunity for students and maintain people and programs that have been expected by the community and allow for growth, especially BOCES: "We support a lot of students... Just CTE (Career and Technical Education) alone upwards of 75 students. We believe those opportunities are so valuable for our students to have, especially for kids where college isn't the right path," said Mr. Peiffer.

The district plans to onboard an extra special education position for the Kindergarten through 2nd Grade level to meet the needs of children, instead of housing a special education program at BOCES. There is also a plan to increase our Pupil Personnel Services department, adding a part-time employee from the BOCES campus.

A ribbon-cutting ceremony is being planned for the month of May for the opening of the brand-new transportation facilities. To pair with the new transportation facilities, the District is waiting for more information on electric transportation vehicles to come after the State budget is passed, as the transition to electric vehicles is still mandated at the state level.

There will be a budget hearing on May 13th in the Addison High School cafeteria (6:00 P.M.) for the public to ask questions about the budget; it will also be further explained. Mr. Peiffer added, "The District has worked hard to develop a budget that supports the strategic plan and the commitment to student success, effectively uses all funding sources with minimal impact on the local tax payers, and protects the district's long term financial health and stability." Information is also stated in the budget newsletter, which will be published and distributed to the community. 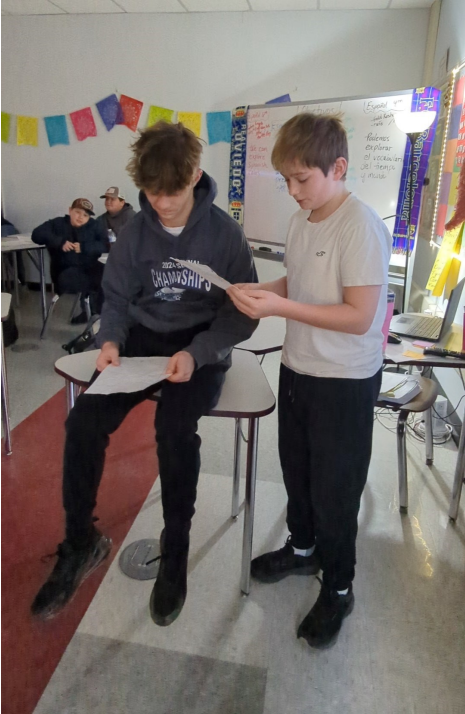

Gross & Fine Motor Activities

You can always find gross motor opportunities at our centers varying for the developmental ability of your child.

The precise movements it takes for a child to pick up a cheerio, write their name or learn to cut are developed through fine motor activities.
